1. Reporting Line:

The Mission Analytical Capability Analyst reports to the Head of Analytical Reporting and Outreach Department (HoAROD).

- To contribute to developing and maintaining Mission Analytical Capability working methodology and relevant Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs);
- To contribute to an integrated gender perspective into the Mission's analyses, where applicable;
- To support the information flow within the Mission;
- To act upon the HoM's information and analysis requirements;
- To identify and report on lessons learned and best practices within the respective field of responsibility;
- To undertake any other related tasks as required by the Line Manager(s).

3. Mission Specific Tasks and Responsibilities:

- To conduct permanent research to detect and interpret emerging challenges and other developments, including regional, which could have a significant effect on the environment in which the Mission conducts its mandated tasks, in order to inform Mission planning, situation awareness and Mission security policy;
