### 1. Reporting Line

The Legal Advisor (International Crimes) reports to the Head of the Mobile Unit, which is a unit deployed across Ukraine, particularly in liberated or adjacent areas.

### 2. Main Tasks and Responsibilities

- To support, mentor, and advise law enforcement bodies and the prosecutors' offices (particularly at the regional level) on the investigation and prosecution of international crimes (i.e., war crimes, crimes against humanity, genocide, and the crime of aggression);
- To support the implementation of the action plan developed by the Mission on its activities in the liberated and adjacent areas of Ukraine and, in particular, the work strand which is dedicated to supporting Ukrainian partners in the field of international crimes;
- To identify and implement capacity-building and training opportunities (including designing and delivering training programmes) for law enforcement officers and prosecutors on the investigation and prosecution of international crimes, covering topics such as International Humanitarian Law, International Criminal Law, Conflict-Related Sexual Violence, missile strikes, torture, and unlawful imprisonment;
- To maintain necessary contacts and build relationships with relevant local counterparts, and to develop and implement project activities in close cooperation with the Mission Headquarters;
- To build relationships with civil society actors across the regions in order to enhance the work of the Mission in supporting the investigation and prosecution of international crimes;
- To liaise closely with all the components of the mission, including the Police Unit, which is responsible for implementing the Mission Implementation Plan, as well as the International Crimes Component;
- To liaise closely with the international community as regards activities, programmes, and projects carried out in the field of international crimes.

### 3. General Tasks and Responsibilities

- To identify and report on lessons learned and best practices within the respective area of responsibility;
- To contribute and ensure timely reporting on activities within the respective area of responsibility;
- To take account of gender equality and human rights mainstreaming in the execution of tasks;
- To undertake any other related tasks as requested by the Line Manager(s).

### 4. Essential Qualifications and Experience

- Successful completion of university studies of at least 4 years attested by a diploma OR a qualification in the National Qualifications Framework which is equivalent to level 7 in the European Qualifications Framework OR a qualification of the second cycle under the framework

of qualifications of the European Higher Education Area, e.g. Master's Degree. The qualification should be in Law; AND

- A minimum of 6 years of relevant professional experience out of which a minimum of 3 years of experience in the investigation or prosecution of international crimes, after having fulfilled the educational requirements.

**5. Essential Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:**

- Knowledge of the investigation and prosecution of international crimes;
- Ability to engage with senior officials/governmental decision makers;
- Ability to mentor, advise, and motivate local counterparts;
- Experience of designing and delivering training;
- Excellent legal drafting skills.

- Experience of prosecuting international crimes at national or international level (specialised court/tribunal or executive international mission);

**7. Desirable Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:**

- Ukrainian and/or Russian language skills.
